It is the result of a \$10 million gift by the Winston Family Foundation that builds on three years of emerging research focused on the link between technology use and teen mental health. We are elated to hear from Erskine Bowles, a former BOV member who received his Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from UNC in 1967. He was the 19th White House Chief of Staff during the Clinton Administration and then became the 16th President of the University of North Carolina system. He is dedicated to student success and understands the importance of removing financial barriers for students. Hence, he provided a \$5 million gift to launch the Blue Sky Scholars Program in 2018. This program is designed to fill an important gap by supporting exceptionally qualified North Carolina residents from middle-class backgrounds who qualify for financial aid but who do not meet the requirements for the Carolina Covenant.
