11:35 a.m. Artificial Intelligence for Engaged Learning and Education

Mohit Bansal

The John R. and Louise S. Parker Professor in Computer Science Lead co-principal investigator at the National Science Foundation's Artificial Intelligence Institute for Engaged Learning

Powerful language and AI models today have become more successful in generating human-like text to hold conversations and answer your diverse questions (although still with some hallucinations and subtle errors). This emerging technology has made higher education examine critical thinking, ethics, and the human dynamics in using AI. We will learn more about how AI is introduced in the areas of higher education and its function, via AI-Driven Narrative-Centered Learning Environments, Embodied Conversational Agents, and Multimodal Learning Analytics. We will also look at extended capabilities such as image video and diagram generation and their potential use in classrooms.

Mohit Bansal oversees core AI research as Carolina partners with the National Science Foundation's Artificial Intelligence Institute for Engaged Learning, which launched in July 2021.

1:05 p.m. How many seconds --- 17 seconds to capture a historic win in 1974

In March 1974, the UNC men's basketball team scored eight points in the final 17 seconds of regulation against Duke University, capped by Walter Davis' 30-foot bank shot from the wing as time expired. The Tar Heels won the game in overtime, 96-92, in one of the most dramatic games in the history of the rivalry. Today, we will hear from people who were a part of that excitement with the 1974 team as they describe and celebrate a historic moment at Carolina.
